Report Cards

Students will be receiving their report cards for the first trimester of this academic year on Thursday, December 6th. We ask that you take the time to go over the report card with your child. Christmas Concert

The Christmas concert will take place in the gymnasium on Wednesday, December 12th in two presentations; one in the afternoon at 1:30 pm and one in the evening at 7:00 pm. Tickets will be limited to two spectators per family for the evening presentation, as we must respect the maximum seating capacity. These two tickets will be sent home in the youngest child's report card. Please note that your tickets will be mandatory at the door for the evening performance. Also note that students attending École La Mission do not need a ticket.

For the unity of the concert, it is essential that all students are present for the evening presentation. This year no specific dress code is required but we would like to recommend students to wear their best clothes.

If you want to film the concert, make sure you have your own energy source (battery) because no socket will be available.

Skating

As part of the physical education program, some classes are planning to teach skating at the rink near the school in January. Students need to wear their skates and mittens and a helmet (mandatory) to ensure their safety. We recommend hockey helmets. We will also accept bicycle helmets. Our goal is to ensure the participation of all students in this school activity.

If your child does not have skates or a helmet, we ask you to write a note to the teacher with your child shoe size so that we can try to find skates for your child. Please also inform us if you have skates that can be made available to other students. Thank you for your cooperation!

It is cold outside...



Make sure that your child is dressed according to weather conditions. We have in the lost and found box several excellent mitts, tuques and sweaters that have no names on them. Please identify your child's clothing and articles with a permanent marker. The family name is sufficient. This little detail helps avoiding a lot of tears and confusion with our little ones.

Sick Students

When a child comes to school sick, he transmits the virus to all those around them. If your child is not feeling well or has a fever, please keep him at home until he is fully recovered. If your child becomes ill during the day, we will notify you so you can pick him up. It is extremely important that you inform us if your child has chickenpox or measles because the disease can be contagious for our students.

SCP (Soutien au comportement positif)

PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports)

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (**PBIS**) is a way for schools to encourage good behavior. With **PBIS**, kids learn about behavior, just as they learn other subjects like math or science. The key to **PBIS** is prevention, not punishment.

PBIS is an approach schools can use to improve school safety. It also helps schools decide how to respond to a child who misbehaves.

PBIS recognizes that kids can only meet behavior expectations if they know what the expectations are. A hallmark of a school using PBIS is that everyone knows what's appropriate behavior. Throughout the school day—in class, at lunch and at recess - kids understand what's expected of them.

PBIS has a few important guiding principles:

- Every child can learn proper behavior.
- Stepping in early can prevent more serious behavior problems.
- Each child is different and schools need to provide many kinds of behavior support.
- How schools teach behavior should be based on research and science.
- Following a child's behavioral progress is important.
- Schools must gather and use data to make decisions about behavior problems.

According to several studies, PBIS leads to better student behavior. In many schools that use PBIS, students receive fewer detentions and suspensions, and get better grades. There's also some evidence that PBIS may lead to less bullying.

École La Mission has started this program four years ago. The SCP school committee has revised some of the procedures and practices. New behavioral expectations posters have been posted throughout the school and these expectations are taught in the classrooms. Students can acquire school bracelets for following school expectations. At the end of the day, these bracelets are counted and recorded in order to be used towards a classroom reward. Once the classroom has reached its own personal magic number based on the number of students in the classroom, the class can then have a classroom reward. Each classroom reward is then counted towards a schoolwide reward.

Although efforts towards rewarding good behavior is heightened, there are still some students that need personal interventions. When school expectations are repeatedly not being followed, a student may receive an **AVIS** card. This card is given to the homeroom teacher who then gives the student a reflexion form. This form is intended to help the student reflect on his behavior and the school expectations that were not followed. With teacher support, the student then determines an appropriate act of kindness. The reflexion form will be sent home to be signed by the parent and the teacher will advise the parent by e-mail.

Lunch Lady
