Safety first! The CSCN and École La Mission want to ensure a safe and secure environment for all students, parents and staff. Two new safety procedures have been put in place in all CSCN schools. First measure is that all doors will be locked at all times except for two transition times, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. The second safety measure enforced is a Criminal Record Check from all parent volunteers. Parents are asked to submit a copy of the Criminal Record Check before engaging in any activity with the students. Bus safety is also very critical. We ask parents to revise the bus safety rules on a continual basis with their child and we ask all parents to please respect the bus zones and use the designated crosswalks for crossing the street. We thank you in advance for your cooperation in helping us keep our school a safe and caring environment!

School News and Activities

School doors locked

The safety of our students and staff are of upmost priority for the CSCN and École La Mission. Two new safety procedures have been put in place in all the CSCN schools. First, all school doors will be locked during normal school hours. Doors will be unlocked during two transition times in the morning and after school. Times when the doors will be unlocked are as follows: 8:42-9:00 am and 3:15-3:30. A new camera, doorbell and speakerphone have been installed. Please ensure that you look directly into the camera when you ring the new doorbell that is located on the right side of the main entry doors. Upon identification you will be granted access.

We thank you for helping us keep your children and the staff at École La Mission safe!

Criminal Record Check

The second safety measure that has been put in place requires all adults to submit a criminal record check before volunteering with students in the school or on field trips. If you plan on volunteering such as reading books in your child's classroom, participating in a classroom during special holiday theme days or volunteering on field trips, etc you will require a criminal record check. All record checks less than six months old will be accepted. A form signed and dated from the school principal has been sent out that allows you to have the criminal check at a special discount or for free. Please ensure to bring this form with you when going to the proper authorities for your criminal record check. Adults from St-Albert can obtain a criminal record check at the following locations:

- 1) RCMP detachments: free with school form signed and dated by the principal
- 2) At the Nexus Business Park (#108, 14315-118 ave) for immediate service

Adults from Edmonton can obtain a criminal record check at the following locatons:

- 1) Nearest City of Edmonton Police detachment
- 2) At the Nexus Business Park (#108, 14315-118 ave) for immediate service

Bus safety

Bus safety week is also in mid-october. Your childs safety on the bus is everyones responsibility; the bus drivers, you as parent and us as a school. We will have bus evacuation practices et will revise bus safety rules with all students. We ask that you revise these bus safety rules often with your child. See link included in the email.

Pedestrian Safety

A reminder that families are asked to use the proper crosswalks when crossing the street. We ask that bus zones be respected at all times. Crossing between buses is NOT a safe practice and shows a bad example to our students. Please respect all bus zones and use the appropriate cross walks.

The volunteer guide has been sent home to all families at the beginning of September. We ask that you take the time to read the guide. If you plan on volunteering at the school, we ask that you fill out the consent form and return it to the school as soon as possible. Note that we cannot accept your help without having received this form in advance. Even if you think of volunteering only once during the school year, it would be a good idea to return the completed form immediately to be ready for the occasion.

Provincial Achievement Tests

We are pleased to share with you the Grade 6 Provincial Achievement Tests results from the June 2018 exams. The purpose of having Achievement Tests is to determine if the Alberta students are learning what they should be learning, to inform Albertans of the results of the students compared to the standards set by the province and to assist the provincial government, the school boards and the schools in determining the specific needs required to help the students reach their full potential. It is important to note that the French Language results are compared only to the results from the four other francophone school boards in the province. All other subject results are compared to all students from all Alberta schools. Please note that students attending the francophone schools write the same English achievement tests as those who attend the English schools.
