# \*\*\* NEW: Leaving for Appointments

In order to maximize the learning time of students in the classroom, we would like to inform you that if you must pick up your child during school hours we ask that you allow yourself enough time. Students will be called out of class **only** once the parents have arrived at the school. Please plan accordingly!

# **Locking school doors**

The CSCN and École La Mission are committed to the safety of all students and staff. Two new security measures have been put in place in all schools of the CSCN. The first step is keeping our doors locked. A camera and a bell were installed to the right of the main entrance doors. You must stand directly in front of the camera before pressing the new doorbell. There will be two transition times during the day. During these transition times, the doors will be unlocked from: 8:42 am to 9:00 am and 3:15 pm to 3:30 pm.

#### Criminal record check

The second security measure in effect is the criminal record check. All adults volunteering for school activities or out-of-school excursions will be asked to submit criminal record check evidence before working with students. If you are thinking of volunteering at the school, such as reading a book to the class, participating in school activities, volunteering for field trips, etc., you need to provide us with a copy of your criminal record check. Any verification dated less than 6 months will be accepted.

To make it easier for you to act quickly, a letter with the principal's signature has already been sent to each family with the youngest child in the family enrolled at the school. Make sure to bring this letter with you to get a reduced cost or no cost at all.

We thank you for your valuable cooperation with this new security measure.

### New curriculum: Kindergarten to grade 4

The new LearnAlberta.ca (formerly known as the Curriculum Development and Management Application, or CDMA) is a custom-developed software tool created to help develop, update and implement provincial curriculum in a digital format. The vision of the new LearnAlberta.ca is to provide a bilingual, one-stop-shop for Alberta teachers, parents, students and all other stakeholders so they can access tools and services related to provincial curriculum. As of mid-October, 2018, this beta version will provide the ability for stakeholders to provide feedback on the website, which will be used to help inform future iterations of this innovative tool.

The provincial curriculum development is on track. New K–4 curriculums in six subject areas are expected to be approved, in principle, in December 2018. Implementation dates have yet to be determined, and current curriculum remains in effect until future curriculum is implemented.

# **Healthy School**

#### It's Cold...

Make sure your child is dressed warmly and wears mittens, a warm tuque and a scarf at all times. The temperature is cool, especially in the morning. Do not forget to label all outdoor clothing and boots. When a child loses an object, this causes many tears and worries. Encourage your child to check the lost and found box as it fills quickly.

#### **Sick Students**

When a child comes to school sick, he transmits the virus to all those around them. If your child is not feeling well or has a fever, please keep him at home until he is fully recovered. If your child becomes ill during the day, we will notify you so you can pick him up. It is extremely important that you inform us if your child has chickenpox or measles since precautionary measures need to be followed in such cases. We strongly encourage parents to have their child immunized against such diseases and other sicknesses.

# **Key information to remember**

# **Punctuality**

- Punctuality is an important value at our school. When your child is late, this has a negative effect on learning in addition to disturbing the class. Let's all develop good habits and be on time!
- Please remember to check in at the office when you arrive at school. In order to limit classroom disruptions, the secretary will call your child to the office to meet with you.
- Halloween is just around the corner which means one thing: sugar! Being a school where we promote health, we do not accept candy at school in your child's lunch box. Research shows that the ability to concentrate is seriously diminished by the consumption of sweets. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

When your child has problems with his/her peers at recess, please encourage him/her to talk with an adult. There are often situations that can be easily managed if addressed immediately.

### **School bus Transportations**



Your bus schedules are available online with e-Link.

If you lose your schedule or a change is made to your bus route, the information is at your fingertips. All you have to do is sign in, using the information that was mailed to you this summer with your child's schedule. If a change is made, a message will be sent at that time to advise you to consult your new schedule online.

#### For the SAFETY of your child ... please read

You must inform the school office as soon as possible of ANY CHANGES regarding your child's transportation needs such as a new address, new sitter or contact information. The school office will then notify the transportation board.

Allow AT LEAST THREE WEEKS before a change is made permanent. In the meantime, you will be assigned a temporary stop as close as possible to your new address. Your bus driver IS NOT AUTHORIZED TO CHANGE THE STOPS. You should not accept a change from your driver because a SUB DRIVER will follow the approved road and will drop off your child at the bus stop indicated on the card.

No student has the right to ride a bus other than the one on which he/she is assigned. If your child needs to take a different bus due to an emergency, you must request permission from the transportation board. An authorization letter will be prepared and given to the student to present to the bus driver.

Always park along Heritage Drive, we do not have enough space in the parking lot to accommodate parents vehicles.

- -Do not park your car in the bus lane from 8:00 am to 9:00am and from 3:00 pm to 4:00 pm.
- -Accompany your child to cross the street.
- -Cross the street using only the marked crosswalk.
- -Never cross between buses. Please go to the corner to cross safely.

By following these instructions, it certainly will help our students to cross the street safely. In addition, by parking further, it will give drivers a better vision of people crossing the street.

We are confident that taking time to reflect and follow these rules, will ensure safe crossing for everyone. We assure you that we make constant efforts to ensure that students get to school and home safely.

A student who does not take his usual bus route in the afternoon must have a signed note by the parent. A student without a note will go on the bus as indicated on the registration form.
