#### **School News and Activities**

#### **School doors**

The safety of our students and staff are of upmost priority for the CSCN and École La Mission. Two new safety procedures have been put in place in all the CSCN schools. First, all school doors will be locked during normal school hours. We ask that you please ring the doorbell located on the right side of the front entry doors in order to gain access to the school. Don't forget to smile directly into the camera when ringing the doorbell. Upon identification you will be granted access. We thank you for helping us keep your children and the staff at École La Mission safe!

# **Criminal Record Check**

The second safety measure requires all adults to submit a criminal record check before volunteering with students in the school or on field trips. If you plan on volunteering such as reading books in your child's classroom, participating in a classroom during special holiday theme days or volunteering on field trips, etc. you will require a criminal record check. All record checks less than six months old will be accepted. A form signed and dated from the school principal could allow you to receive the criminal check at a special discount or for free. Please ensure to bring this form with you when going to the proper authorities for your criminal record check. A copy of these documents were sent out in September but can also be found on the school web site under the following tab: Formulaires et documents utiles. We thank you for your understanding and cooperation!

Adults from St-Albert can obtain a criminal record check at the following locations:

- 1) RCMP detachments : free with school form signed and dated by the principal
- 2) At the Nexus Business Park (#108, 14315-118 ave) for immediate service

Adults from Edmonton can obtain a criminal record check at the following locatons:

- 1) Nearest City of Edmonton Police detachment
- 2) At the Nexus Business Park (#108, 14315-118 ave) for immediate service

If you have submitted a criminal record check last year during the 2018-2019 academic school year, you need only sign the renewal document validating that the information is still truthful and correct. A criminal record check is valid five years from the date it has been received by the school board. A renewal document can be signed for the next four years thereafter.

### **Volunteer Guide and Consent Form**

The volunteer guide has been sent home to all families at the beginning of September. We ask that you take the time to read the guide. If you plan on volunteering at the school, we ask that you fill out the consent form and return it to the school as soon as possible. If you have misplaced the copy, please download a copy from our school website under the tab *Formulaires et documents utiles* and send it back to school as soon as possible. Note that we cannot accept your help without having received this form in advance. Even if you think of volunteering only once during the school year, it would be a good idea to return the completed form immediately to be ready for the occasion.

#### **Pedestrian Safety**

A reminder that families are asked to use the proper crosswalks when crossing the street. We ask that bus zones be respected at all times. Crossing between buses is NOT a safe practice and shows a bad example to our students. Please respect all bus zones and use the appropriate crosswalks.

#### **Provincial Achievement Tests**

We are pleased to share with you the Grade 6 Provincial Achievement Tests results from the June 2019 exams. The purpose of having Achievement Tests is to determine if the Alberta students are learning what they should be learning, to inform Albertans of the results of the students compared to the standards set by the province and to assist the provincial government, the school boards and the schools in determining the specific needs required to help the students reach their full potential. It is important to note that the French Language results are compared only to the results from the four other francophone school boards in the province. All other subject results are compared to all students from all Alberta schools. Please note that students attending the francophone schools write the same English achievement tests as those who attend the English schools.
