Key information to remember

School fees and supplies

Registration fees must be paid by September 30th, 2019. We know your time is valuable, so we are happy to offer you the School Cash Online service. It is a fast, convenient and safe way to pay without the need for cash or cheque. Instructions to register for School Cash Online have been sent to all families by email and can be found on our web site.

Similarly, it is very important for your child to have all the school supplies required for his / her school level in order to function properly in the classroom. A list of required school supplies was sent home with the June report card. You can also find the school supply list on the school's website under the parent tab.

Report an absence

For security reasons, your child's absence must be reported. The parent must justify the absence of his child:

We will send an automated message for all non-reported absences

Please inform your bus company when your child does not take the bus.

Late for school

If your child arrives late at school, he/she she must report to the office to inform us of his/her presence. The student will receive a late slip to give to the teacher.

Punctuality

The school strives to make students responsible citizens.

Punctuality is an important value in our school. Each parent is responsible for the attendance of their child. A child that is late for school will often feel stressed for missing part of the lesson being taught and late arrivals can disturb other students. Tardiness also has the effect of reducing a student's motivation and can lead the child to believe that "school is not important." Help us transmit the importance of school and learning by showing exemplary punctuality. We are all role models for our children!

The first bell is at 8:42 in the morning. Students should be seated and ready to start on time in the classroom, first thing in the morning. It is a sign of respect for the teacher and all classmates and it is especially critical in developing punctual future habits.

To all parents who transport their child to and from school on a regular base or occasionally and parents of a child attending afterschool daycare

Students may arrive no sooner than 8:17 am.

Before this time, there is no supervision.

The bell to enter the school in the morning is at 8:42 am.

Students may not enter the school before the bell.

All students are requested to return home at the end of classes.

The parent who picks up his child must arrive between 3:20 pm and 3:30 pm.

Supervision ceases for these students at 3:30 pm

The parent, who picks up his child at the end of classes, must wait outside in the areas designated for parents; either in front of the main doors or in front of the East and West exits of the school, depending on your child's exit door. Your child will join you outside.

**We ask parents who are waiting outside, to free the sidewalks for students who are walking towards the buses. We ask that you wait on the lawn area.

The parent who picks up his child from the daycare is asked to go to the daycare to sign out their child and wait for their child inside the daycare. Your child will join you at the daycare.

The parent who picks up his child who is on a regular bus route is asked to report the change first thing in the morning to the office and child's teacher. Your child will join you outside. If the school has not been notified, the parent should report to the office so that we can notify the teacher and your child will join you at the office.

Any parent wishing to circulate in the school, at any time, is welcome and must report their presence at the office to receive a visitor's card.

It is important to maintain a consistent routine. These security measures allow the teachers and daycare educators to ensure the safety of all students entrusted to them when they leave school.

We thank you for your understanding and cooperation. The school entrance bell in the morning rings at 8:42 am.

The bus lane is strictly reserved for school buses between 8:15 am to 8:45 am and 3:00 pm to 4:00 pm.

Supervision

Bus supervision in the morning and evenings, at the front of the school, will be by the principal, Mme Marielle Perich. Two supervisors will be outside at all times for every school recess. During lunch, there will be a supervisor in each hallway to monitor students. For safety reasons, the exterior doors will be locked during the school day.





Safety First - Parking Information for École La Mission

This information sheet has been compiled by the St. Albert Municipal Enforcement Service in conjunction with the RCMP and La Mission School. The safety of the children is our first priority. These parking and traffic restrictions are intended to provide safe movement of vehicles and pedestrians within the school zone. Please help keep our children safe by parking legally and obeying the traffic control devices.

Jaywalking

Jaywalking is prohibited in school zones. All pedestrians must use crosswalks when crossing a road. **\$100 Fine**Bus Lane

No Stopping or Parking at any time in the Bus lane in front of the school. Buses only all day. **\$80 Fine Crosswalk**

No Stopping or Parking within 5 meters of the crosswalk markings on the road on either side. **\$80 Fine Stop Signs**

No Stopping or Parking within 5 meters of the Stop Signs. \$78 Fine

Driveways

It is prohibited to stop or park within 1.5 meters (5 feet) of a driveway. \$78 Fine

Transit Zones

The City has one Transit Zone in the area. Stopping/Parking is prohibited all day from the Transit Sign extending 30 meters back. **\$80 Fine**

Visitor Parking/Staff Parking

Staff parking is located on the East side of the School. All stalls in this area are reserved for Staff members and authorized service vehicles only. **\$80 Fine**

U-Turns

Are not prohibited on Heritage Drive from and including Hardcastle Place to and including Harvest Court. **\$115 Fine Double Parking/Improper Parallel Parking**

When you parallel park in a permitted area, you must do so with the passenger side tires of your vehicle no more than 50cm from the curb/edge of the roadway. **\$80 Fine**

In addition, you cannot Stop or Park beside a vehicle that is stopped or parked in a permitted area. This means that you cannot double-park beside the buses or any other vehicles parked on Heritage Drive or surrounding crescents.

\$78 Fine

Sidewalks & Private Property

Stopping or Parking o n a sidewalk or in someone's private driveway is also prohibited. \$80 Fine

This information sheet is not law nor does it contain all parking or traffic related offences. This is intended to give general knowledge on some common parking and traffic offences/problems in the La Mission School area when picking up, dropping off children or visiting the school. These offences are a combination of Municipal Bylaws and Provincial Traffic Laws. For more information on the Municipal Laws please call the City of St. Albert at 459-1500. School doors locked

The safety of our students and staff are of upmost priority for the CSCN and École La Mission. All school doors will be locked at all times. A camera, doorbell and speakerphone is located on the right side of the main entry doors. Please ensure that you look directly into the camera when you ring the doorbell. Upon identification you will be granted access. We thank you for helping us keep your children and the staff at École La Mission safe!

Parents and visitors

We recognize that parental involvement in the school is essential. If you wish to volunteer your time, you are absolutely welcome! We ask that you first contact your child's teacher to verify the need and establish an appropriate time for the volunteer help. You must have a Criminal Record Check in order to do any volunteering at the school.

When you enter the school, we ask that you register at the front office where you will receive a visitor card. We ask that you wear this card at all times when you are in the school. This identification helps all staff identify the adults present and welcomed in the school. All adults without a visitor card will be questioned. It is also very important not to disturb the operation and teaching in the classrooms. Similarly, if you pick up your child for an appointment, we ask you to come to the office and wait for your child at the front entrance. We will contact your child upon your arrival.

Criminal Record Check

A new procedure was established last year, by the school board, for volunteer parents. Any adult volunteer is **required** to have a criminal record check in order to volunteer for any school activities! If you plan on volunteering such as reading books in your child's classroom, participating in a classroom during special holiday theme days or volunteering on field trips, etc you will require a criminal record check. All record checks less than six months old will be accepted. A form signed and dated from the school principal will allow you to have the criminal check at a special discount or for free. Please ensure to bring this form with you when going to the proper authorities for your criminal record check. A copie of these documents can also be found on the school web site under the following tab: Formulaires et documents utiles.

Adults from St-Albert can obtain a criminal record check at the following locations:

- 1) RCMP detachments : free with school form signed and dated by the principal
- 2) At the Nexus Business Park (#108, 14315-118 ave) for immediate service

Adults from Edmonton can obtain a criminal record check at the following locatons:

- 1) Nearest City of Edmonton Police detachment
- 2) At the Nexus Business Park (#108, 14315-118 ave) for immediate service

If you have already submitted a Criminal Record Check in the last 2018- 2019 school year, you will simply have to submit a signed document attesting that the information is still valid. The document will be supplied by the school and will be forwarded to all families shortly.

You will soon receive our School Volunteer Guide. Please read through the guide, you will find important information regarding your role and responsibilities as a school volunteer. You will also find the code of ethics, which we ask all volunteers to respect when doing volunteer work at the school.

Transportation

*** Important***

Your bus schedules are now available online with e-Link.

If you lose your schedule or a change is made to your bus route, the information is at your fingertips. All you have to do is sign in, using the information that was mailed to you this summer with your child's schedule. If a change is made, a Synrevoice will be sent at that time to advise you to consult your new schedule online.

If however, you do not have internet access, please, notify the school immediately to receive a paper copy of your schedule.

Please note that the office of transportation and operations no longer responds to complaints about school transportation by phone. If you have a complaint or any concerns about school bus transportation, please use the online complaints service on the School Board's website:

Once the form is completed and submitted online, an employee from the transportation office will contact you as soon as possible.

This Question & Answer fact sheet explains, for example, what to do when the bus is late, how to change your contact information and new policies on walking distances in order to maximize the efficiency of the bus routes.

We remind you that parents are fully responsible for the safety and behavior of their child until they get on the bus and once they get off the bus.

A student who does not take his usual bus route in the afternoon must have a signed note by the parent. A student without a note will go on the bus as indicated on the registration form.

Healthy School

Healthy snacks

Students eat snacks every day at school. We ask that you supply healthy snacks for your child. Good eating habits start at an early age and can greatly influence your child's health and well being. Examples of healthy snacks include fruits, vegetables, yogurt, etc.

We ask that **you do not send any foods that may contain nuts,** this includes peanut butter. We have several students and a staff member with severe allergies.

We also ask that you do not send unhealthy snacks to school. Chips, candy, chocolate bars and carbonated soft drinks are not acceptable snacks for students. Please avoid sending these snacks to school. If a student does bring these snacks, the teacher will ask the child to bring the snack back home.

Hot Lunches – Lunch Lady

We offer a hot lunch program every Wednesday. All orders can be placed on line at www.thelunchlady.ca Pleae follow the website directives to order a hot lunch for your child. Hot lunches will begin every Wednesday as of September 11th.

Milk program

The school offers a milk program. Milk coupons are available to purchase with School Cash Online at the cost of 23\$ for 27 coupons. Please note that individual tickets are not sold. Students must have a coupon in order to purchase milk offered at lunchtime.

Physical Daily Activity

Daily physical activity is important in order to lead a healthy life style. Every classroom offers physical daily activities for 30 minutes every day.

Weekly information bulletin! A reminder of the upcoming school's activities for the week will be sent via e-mail every Friday. Be sure to read the bulletin in order to make sure you don't miss out on an important school activity.

**Important: Permission forms and other documents will be sent home regularly. Parents are responsible to sign and send the permission back to school with their child. A student without a permission form on the day of the fieldtrip will stay at school. We will not accept permissions over the phone.
