# **Survey**

From January to the end of February, Alberta Education will be conducting the annual Accountability Pillar Survey. You should have received the Alberta Education survey at the beginning of January. Students in grades 4 to 6 and all teachers will be completing their surveys online at school. All surveys are anonymous. In addition to English and French, the parent survey is available in many other languages. Your participation in the survey helps provide important information on the quality of education your child is receiving; we encourage you to please take the time to fill out the survey. Your feedback is important to us. The deadline to fill out the survey is on February 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2019.

Survey results will be available to school authorities in May 2019, and will be reported publicly as part of their 3-Year Education Plans and Annual Education Results Reports. Thank you for taking the time to give us your feedback!

# **Key Information to Remember**

# **Going on Vacation?**

Please note, the School Board administrative policy for absences: "When parents withdraw their children from school for an extended period of time (example: a trip, vacation, etc.), principals and teachers are not required to provide homework, exercises, projects, etc.to the student during the period of absence or upon his return. However, work can be prepared if the teacher is willing to do so".

# Parents driving their child to school

Please respect the security signs outside the school and do not enter the staff parking lot, the disabled parking or the school bus lane.

The bus entrance in front of the school is strictly reserved for school buses between 8:15 - 8:45 and 15:00 - 16:00.

In addition, let's be good neighbors by making sure not to block the entrance to the houses on Holly Crescent which is directly across from our school.

The St. Albert RCMP reminds motorists and parents that all traffic laws must be respected. Here are the most common problems in school zones:

- Interfering with traffic by causing dangerous situations = \$ 115 fine
- Make a "U-turn" in the street (parents drop off their children, then turn on the street to go in the opposite direction) = \$ 115 fine
- Park within 1.5 meters of an entrance = fine of \$ 57
- Parking within 5 meters of a pedestrian crossing = \$ 57 fine

Please, plan your day to give yourself more time and act safely.

### **Absences**

For security reasons, your child's absence must be reported.

The parent must justify the absence of his child;

# **Punctuality**

We noticed lately that a lot of students arrive late at school in the morning. The school is a tool of social education and strives to make students responsible citizens.

Punctuality is an important value in our school. Each parent is responsible for the attendance of their child. A child that arrives late feels stressed for missing part of the lesson being taught and late arrivals in class disturbs others. Tardiness also has the effect of reducing the student's motivation and can believe that "school is not important." Let us not suggest that message by showing exemplary punctuality. We are role models for our children.



The first bell is at 8:42 in the morning. Students should be seated and ready to start on time in the classroom first thing in the morning. It is a show of respect for the teacher and all classmates but it is also critical in developing good future habits.
