#### Halloween

This year we still encourage students to dress in orange and black for Halloween at school. But we will allow students to wear a costume <u>only</u> for the afternoon activities. We will not accept any makeup, masks or weapons. The school staff gives itself the right to refuse a costume that does not meet the stated expectations. The students will be given 20 minutes to dress up after lunch recess in their classroom. The morning of October 31<sup>st</sup> will be an ordinary morning with regular classes. Halloween activities will begin in the afternoon around 1 pm and finish around 3 pm.

In addition, being a school where we promote health, **it is not permitted** to bring sweets to share during Halloween, Christmas, Valentine's Easter, etc. The card exchange is still allowed but not mandatory.

We continue to allow snacks for the class on the birthday of the child. We encourage you to think about making a healthy choice if you decide to bring a snack for your child's birthday.

Your bus schedules are now available online with e-Link.

If you lose your schedule or a change is made to your bus route, the information is at your fingertips. All you have to do is sign in, using the information that was mailed to you this summer with your child's schedule. If a change is made, a Synrevoice will be sent at that time to advise you

to consult your new schedule online.

If however you do not have internet access, please, notify the school immediately to receive a paper copy of your schedule.

A student who does not take his usual bus route in the afternoon must have a signed note by the parent. A student without a note will go on the bus as indicated on the registration form.
